
History:

Of the Presbyterian Church in Wanganui: Origins – first churches – Sunday School, Vicarage, etc. Plus Avenue properties (cross-ref)

Resources Consulted: Wanganui District Council Building files: Wanganui Borough Council Register of Building Permits, Archives Ref AAF 174:1 – NOT YET FOUND. Wanganui Borough Council 1908 Insurance Assessment Plan – this block not included. Gray Young's plans (6 sheets) for the church are amongst the St Paul's archives at the Whanganui Regional Museum – to be consulted.
Comments on Significance:
Historic Presbyterians active in Wanganui from an early date – links with Taylor family and other important founders of the City. Memorials
Architectural William Gray Young – important architect. Intact. Comparison with Collegiate Chapel (same architect)
Context Streetscape – offsets District Council chambers opposite – with Power Board offices on corner of same block.
